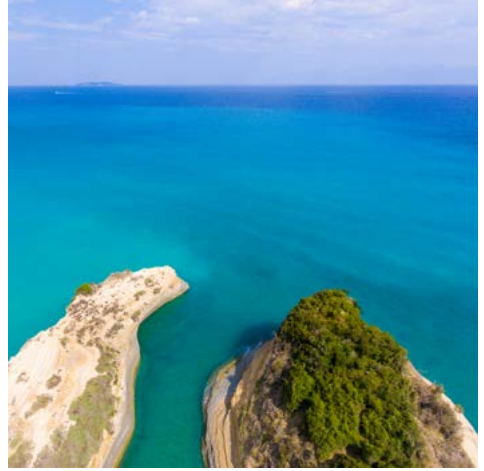
KASSIOPI (45min)

KAPODISTRIAS MUSEUM (20min)

THE DURRELLS

ARCHAEOLOGICAL MUSEUM OF CORFU

THE CHURCH OF ST. SPYRIDON

The most revered church in Corfu, dedicated to the island's patron saint. Inside, visitors can see the silver sarcophagus containing the saint's relics and admire the impressive ceiling paintings and intricate Venetian-style decor that define this spiritual landmark.

THE OLD SYNAGOGUE

A historical synagogue built in the 16th century, representing Corfu's once-thriving Jewish community. Tucked away in the town's old Jewish quarter, it remains a significant cultural and religious site, offering insight into the island's diverse heritage.

THE BRITISH CEMETERY
